Requirements and Procedures

Qualifying Candidates:

Senior students enrolled in any fine arts Pathway program including: the visual arts, music programs, the performing arts (dance, drama, theater).

Senior students who have a 3.0 GPA and above in their fine arts pathway courses, with a total GPA of 2.8 and above on their first semester of Senior year transcripts.

Senior students who have met all of the following performance/portfolio requirements by the given year's deadline dates.

2017-2018 Deadline date for Performance/portfolio submission:

All students who qualify have to be turned into the appropriate Fine arts/music coordinator via courier or Office 365 mailbox by <u>March 15, 2018</u> fully reviewed and accepted by the onsite teacher of record/panel in order to meet this year's state deadline.

Senior Candidates Requirements:

*Senior students must have presented/participated in at least 2 district wide arts events in their high school tenure. These events include but are not limited to; The Art Star awards, regional art shows/showcases, dramatic productions/performances, EXPRESSIONS district wide student and teacher arts showcase, GMEA events, honor bands, chorus, large group performance evaluations, stage productions, All State events (all/any area). Each senior candidate must have completed 20 total hours of community service arts related events, the above events will fulfill that requirement for the state.

Senior CAPSTONE Requirements: (all Pathways)

The Capstone Process is below. Each teacher of record, must conduct the Capstone process for each senior candidate on the school site location. The teacher may form a Capstone review team of (2-4) persons to review the candidate's final Capstone portfolio, presentation and/or performance. Once completed the rubric form must be sent with the verification form to the appropriate fine arts/music coordinator. The written portion of the Capstone process must be sent in with the senior candidate's Final Verification form also.

3 total items must be sent in by the deadline, March 15, 2018; to the appropriate district wide fine arts/music coordinator.

- The Senior Candidate's completed rubric form.
- The Senior Candidate's written portion of the Capstone process.
- The Senior Candidate's Final Verification form.

*Once all 3 items have been submitted via courier/email to the appropriate coordinator by March 15, 2018. All qualifying candidates will be added to the DeKalb County School's Fine Arts Seal approved list for the 2017-2018 graduation. The verified list will come to all fine arts teachers. The state will send the Seals to each school on April 2018.

The Performing arts/MUSIC Capstone Process:

The performing arts (music, dance and drama) capstone will be a final piece/performance any genre or medium presented by the student. This assessment can be a solo or group performance. The final piece must be based on studied theory and practice of any artist/movement in connection to a 21st century issue. The portfolio will be reviewed, scored and assessed by the teacher of record or chosen panel based on the following rubric:

The Written Artist's Statement Capstone Process: (All Pathways)

*PLEASE COMPOSE YOUR OWN SITE BASED RUBRIC FOR THE WRITTEN ARTIST STATEMENT.
The district allotted pts. Are 10.

My RUBRIC recommendation:

4 pts. Grammatically correct, 2 pts. Real world applicable, 2pts. A connection to a 21st century issue or problem., 2 pts. Art history/artist of influence on their body of work.

For a total of 10 points.

Each Senior Candidate (all areas music and the fine arts) must submit with their final portfolio/performance a written artist's statement about their body of work. This artist's statement must address the following 3 areas: art history or artist of influence on their own artistic approach/process; a real life, real world application/influence to their body of work or performance, a connection to a 21st century issue or problem. The written artist's statement must be 2-5 pages, double spaced, time new roman and at least a 12 point font.

Each Senior Candidate's written artist's statement must be scored by their teacher of record/evaluation panel before being submitted to the district. Qualifying candidates must have a score of 8 and above, on a 1-10 pt. scale to qualify for the district wide seal.

The written artist's statement is a portion of the final verification from the DeKalb County school district and must be submitted along with their final verification form for approval.

FINAL QUALIFYING SCORES FOR SENIOR FINE ARTS DIPLOMA SEALS:

Visual arts: 15-22 points (total, including their written artist's statement's scores).

Performing arts; Music, Dance, Theater and Drama: 15-22 points (total, including their written artist's statement's scores).
