

## Tri-M Honor Society Point Rules

### I. Important Info

- A. **Points:** You need 25 points per semester. If you do not accumulate 25 points per semester you will be placed on probation. After not accumulating your necessary points for 2 semesters in a row, you will be removed from Tri-M.
- B. **Recitals:** These are semi-formal events. Please dress up, especially if you plan to perform. It can be an etude, song, or performance of others. If you are singing a solo, there must be live musical accompaniment, or harmonies sung with others. Classical style is preferred. You are the Modern Music Masters after all.
- C. **Dues:** Dues are \$15. It pays for pins, cards, cords, and hopefully t-shirts and food for future events. Make checks out to **Lakeside Chorus Boosters**. Deliver the money to Mr. FitzStephens. **If you do not pay dues, you will not receive a cord.**

### II. Points

- A. If you **only** watch a concert, you will **only** receive 2 points regardless of how long it was.
- B. Do not count meetings on your point sheets.
- C. Service and volunteer events are 1 point per 15 minutes. This includes ushering, volunteering at any music-related event, playing music as service (like at a nursing home), or volunteering in any way for a music organization, as long as you receive nothing in return (i.e. grades, compensation, etc.).
- D. Show that you attended the event by turning in a pamphlet/program, taking a picture, or getting a signature.
- E. If you audition for anything, you will get 2 points.
- F. Performing in a non-school concert (if you receive a grade for it, it doesn't count) is 1 point per 15 minutes of concert time.
- G. One-Act/Spring Musical participants (including sound/lights, crew, cast, orchestra) receive 12 points total for this activity.
- H. All-State, JanFest, and similar events - receive 8 points for this activity.
